

What do the kids do at this Program?

All students will have large group, small group, orchestra, fiddle and drumming classes. There will also be a lunch period and recreational breaks spaced throughout the day. All students will have the opportunity to play a pre-prepared solo on a recital during the week. If a student chooses to do so, they must have a signed permission slip from their private/school teacher stating that they are prepared to perform on this recital with a specific song listed.

When Does this Program Start and End?

This week-long program will begin at 9am each day and will end at 3:30pm. Morning care beginning at 8AM and/or afternoon care until 6PM are available for additional fees. There will be a culminating concert at the end of the week, Friday at 2:30pm, which all parents and friends are invited and encouraged to attend!

Students need to bring their own lunches, snacks and drinks. The following food choices are available for purchase. *After-lunch* smoothies on Wednesday, Chick-

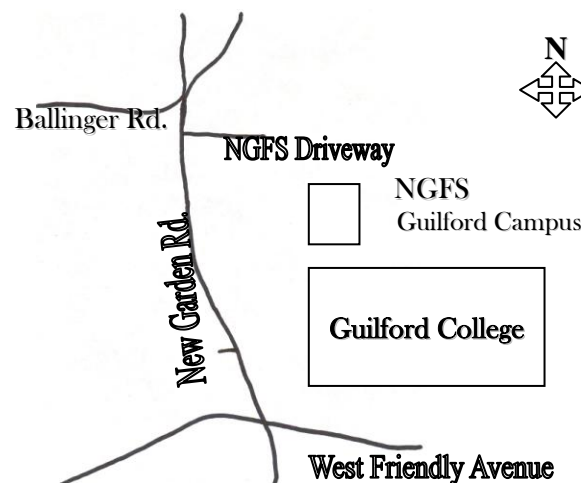
Fil-A on Thursday, & Pizza on Friday. Forms for those choices are available Monday morning, the first day of the program, and need to be paid for at that time.

What is Friendly Violins??

Friendly Violins is a program designed to provide a week of concentrated music study and musical enjoyment for students already involved in Suzuki violin lessons. The program will run for 1 week Monday-Friday, July 19-23 from 9am-3:30pm.

Who can participate in Friendly Violins???

Friendly Violins is designed for rising 4th through 8th grade students who are already involved in Suzuki violin lessons. This program will run concurrently with the New Garden Friends School Summer Program.

We will visit the Guilford College campus to see a performance at the Eastern Music Festival (EMF). Luckily, we are located on the edge of the Guilford College Campus. We will walk the short distance to Dana Auditorium.



FEES

The Course fee is \$225. This covers the camp hours from 9am-3:30pm, Monday-Friday. A \$50 deposit (which will apply to your Course fee) must be mailed in with the registration form by June 1 to save a spot for your child.

Extended Care is available from 8am-8:45am in the morning, and from 3:45pm-6pm in the afternoon.

\$40 per week for afternoon care only

\$20 per week for morning care only; \$4 per day

Part time extended care in the afternoon is **\$2.00** for each ½ hour.

This program can be used informally on a drop in basis, but please try to prearrange all extended care hours when possible.
